ASABE REVISES TERMINOLOGY STANDARD FOR SOIL AND WATER

ST JOSEPH, MICHIGAN— The American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers (ASABE) has initiated the revision of the soil and water terminology standard, S526, to establish a framework for soil and water engineering terminology that will encourage a consistent terminological foundation for current and future use in standards and research.
